

Bible Study July [05<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup>] 2021

Theme of the year: "Victory only through Faith and Obedience"

THEME: TRUST and wait on GOD'S SALVATION

They that trust in the Lord shall never be confounded [Confused] -- George Muller

**PURPOSE:** Understand why we need to trust God even when life seems to contradict God's promises

## 1. Read Isaiah Chapter 51

The chapter begins with "listen" [NIV] or "hearken" [KJV+], which in the original Hebrew text is *shâma*', (pronounced as *shaw-mah'*) meaning to "*hear intelligently*".

- a. Why do you think it is important to listen to God? See Jeremiah 7:24, Zechariah 7:13, Luke 11:22, Matthew 7:24, Revelation 3:20, Romans 10:17, Matthew 4:4
- b. How many times is Isaiah compelling people to *listen* or *hearken* in this chapter?
- c. Do you think that we also sometimes have trouble listening to God?
  - i. Does that affect our trust in God in some way?
- d. What counsel is God giving to His People in verses 1-3?
- e. How does the Lord's past faithfulness encourage you the *called*, and *elected* of God?
- f. What lessons do we learn from Abraham [Genesis 15:6] and Sarah [Hebrews 11:11] in this season?
- g. What other characters in the Bible encourage you and gives you faith to trust in God? How does verse **3** encourage you as a child beloved of God?
- 2. What highlights do we need not to doubt in verses 4-6?
  - a. How can we be encouraged by the God's righteousness and salvation in this season? See also Psalm 37:39, Psalm 62:1-2, Psalm 40:10, Psalm 103:6, Isaiah 56:1
  - b. What does verse **6** remind us about the second coming of Christ? See also Revelation 6:12-17, Matthew 24:35, II Peter 3:7-10
- 3. Why should we fear God and not men even when they insult us about our faith? See verses **7-8**, **12** and Matthew 10:28, Psalm 27:1, II Chronicles 20:17 then verses **22-25**.
  - a. What do verses 7-8 remind us to focus?
  - b. In verses **12-13**, God's people seemed to fear Babylon, than acknowledging the greatness of God's power.

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- i. What are those areas of our lives do we continually fear in this season, that we are supposed to embrace with the greatness of God's power?
- 4. Awake! Awake! What do you think should be the basis of awaking our faith to the power and greatness of our God in this season? See verses **9-16.** Note that in reality it is not the Lord to awake it is you and I. See Psalm 121:3-4, Isaiah 50:7.
  - a. In what ways do we forget God in challenging times? See also Jeremiah 3:21-22
  - b. What does the author mean by the "Arm of the Lord" in verse 9?
  - c. Why do we also need to be spiritually awake as children of God in the last days? See Romans 13:11-12
  - d. How do we stay spiritually awake according to Romans 13:12-14?
- 5. In verse **16** God spoke to Israel, but His word was to be fulfilled by His servant. This draws us to the aspect of "**Inspiration**", whereby God himself uses a human channel to communicate to His people.
  - a. Why is the "Rhema" spoken word from God very significant for this season and in the days to come? Read Isaiah 50:4-5, Luke 21:15, I Corinthians 2:13, II Chronicles 24:20, Ezekiel 3:17, II Kings 3:11-13 then 17:13.
- 6. How does the Lord describe Himself in verses 12, 15, 22?
  - a. Knowing that the Lord comforts, how often have you called Him to comfort you or others in affliction?
  - b. In what ways does the Lord comfort? See verse 3, 12 and Psalm 119:50, Isaiah 66:13, Zechariah 1:13, John 14:16, Romans 15:4.
- What have you done in this season to awaken your faith as you call upon the Lord?
  a. Otherwise, how did the Covid-Pandemic awaken your faith?
- 8. What lessons have you learned from the Bible study that you can apply in the next coming days?

## Prayer

Our heavenly Father, instruct our tongues by the Holy Spirit to speak the words that encourage, comfort and sustains the weary in this season. Awaken our ears morning-by-morning and day by day to listen to your voice. **Amen** [*Isaiah 50:4-5*]
